"Your Young People Shall See Visions"

We often say, "The young people are the future of our church." It's partially true in that they'll be here a bit longer than the rest of us, but that's about the extent of it. The saying can actually mislead us into thinking their importance lies somewhere out in the future, rather than in the here and now.

Joel, one of the minor prophets of the Old Testament, takes a more intergenerational approach to church life. God speaks these prophetic words through him: "I will pour out my Spirit on everyone: your sons and daughters will prophesy (proclaim my message), your old men will have dreams, and your young people will see visions."

Notice how most of the signs of this outpouring are communicated through "your sons and daughters... your young people." Joel, who predated Christ by some 800 years, was looking forward to the advent of the New Testament Church and the indwelling of the Holy Spirit.

According to Joel, vision and prophecy are the primary indicators of a church's spiritual vitality. Proverbs 29:18 goes so far as to say, "Without vision my people perish." Clearly, our young people play a vital role in our church's present and future life.

In the next few months, we will be planning our church's ministry for 2026. My prayer is that we will continue to be the kind of church envisioned by Joel. One that is intergenerational, where everyone's voice, especially that of our young people, is heard. We need their spirit and vision; they need our love and care.
