"Thanksgiving, A Posture Of The Heart"

Friends, Thanksgiving is always in season! It cultivates a godly heart and empowers us to participate in God's amazing work going on all around us. A beautiful example of this is the story of Jesus feeding the 5,000, found in all four Gospels. His spirit of thanksgiving was the catalyst for all the good that followed.

For instance, before distributing the loaves and fish, Jesus gave thanks. Think about it, this came **before** the miracle, not after...which is just the opposite of how most approach thanksgiving. He shows us that thanksgiving is first and foremost an act of faith. It celebrates the character of God, who is faithful, good and all powerful. He delights in taking even the humblest offerings and doing something amazing with it! When we follow Jesus's example of giving thanks it enables us to trust the character of God with any need that we might face. That's the starting point of everything!

Jesus also shows that thanksgiving moves us to compassion. He looked upon the multitude and asked the hard question, "What can I/we do to make a difference here?" The answer was obvious to Him, i.e., sharing what we have with them, no matter how small it may seem. Sadly, His disciples didn't want to go there. I guess even the best of us are still in training when it comes to this matter. But the really big question for us is, will we like them, at least cooperate with Him and learn a priceless lesson of the kingdom?

Last of all, Jesus shows us that thanksgiving inspires what is surely the acid test of true Christian discipleship... sacrificial living. He took what the boy surrendered and multiplied it a thousandfold! A few months later Jesus would do something like this as well, only on a much grander scale. He was living true to His word, "Very truly I tell you, unless a kernel of wheat falls to the ground and dies, it remains only a single seed. But if it dies, it produces many seeds." (Jn 12:24) I hope we see ourselves as some of those seedlings! This story is a beautiful reminder that thanksgiving isn't just a holiday, it's a posture of the heart. It can't be learned in a day but must be practiced every day and in every situation. What are the situations facing us today? Let us give thanks in them by trusting in God's faithfulness to provide, showing compassion to others and surrendering ourselves in service to Him.
